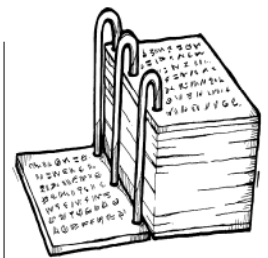

Chuck Sperry Preaches

Elder Chuck Sperry and his children stopped in Wichita on their way back to Honduras in September. The family had hoped to be in Honduras in June. However, their return to their home of eleven years was delayed by the need for Sister Regina Sperry to have surgery and the need to deal with a post operative infection.

Regina is now improving and will be flying to Honduras later. The rest of the family began their drive home September 9. They agreed to pause in Wichita to bring ministry to Zion's Outpost before continuing.

Elder Sperry preached on Sunday, September 10. He related a testimony about the opportunity to witness to a neighbor in Independence. This opportunity arose because of

their need to stay in the U.S. for Regina's health.

The neighbor had heard that the Sperry family were missionaries and brought cookies to them. This allowed a chance to speak to the woman about the gospel. She testified that when she came to their house the first time, that she felt the presence of holy angels.

This testimony was very critical because the woman did not know that the Sperry's were "Latter Day Saints." She said she would not have come to them if she had known that. But she was convinced to hear more by the testimony of the angels. Her family is now investigating the gospel.

Chuck spoke of other missionary efforts in Honduras. In

Pray every day and ask the Lord for an opportunity to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ with somebody you meet.

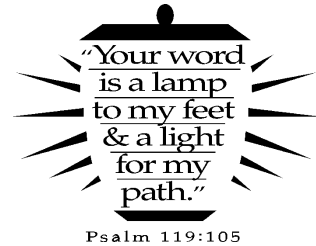
30 Books of the Bible

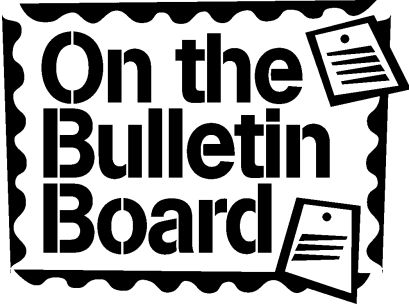
